Admission to Primary 1 for September 2022

Application forms for Primary 1 should be completed online through the link on the Education Authority website www.eani.org.uk.

The portal will be open from **noon on Monday 10th January 2022** and will close **at noon on Friday 28th January 2022**.

Your child's birth certificate and any other necessary documentation should be uploaded to the document hub. The application form will tell you how to do this.

Swimming Programme

The swimming programme for P6 children will begin on **Wednesday 5 January until Wednesday 9 February.** The swimming programme for P5 children will commence on **Wednesday 23 February until Wednesday 30 March.**

Swimming for P4 children will take place after our Easter break.

Children are to bring their swimming kit along with a contribution of £2.00 each week.

Children are not to bring any valuables with them to the pool.

Love Your Heart Day - Monday 14 February - NON UNIFORM DAY

On Monday 14 February Mrs Neill, our school cook, will be organising a special menu to focus on healthy foods which are important to maintain a healthy heart. This will be a non-uniform day - the children can wear something red.

There will be a voluntary donation of £1.00 to go to The British Heart Foundation.

Fitness Freddy - Energy Fitness Day - Tuesday 15 February 2022 - non-uniform Sports Wear Day

All of the children in the school will take part in a sponsored fitness day. All proceeds go towards school funds.

PDMU - Drug Awareness - first session Friday 25 February

Jeannie Graham, from 'Portadown Temperance Council' will be working with children from P6 and P7 on areas linked to Drug Awareness over a five-week period.

School Photographer - Monday 7 March

The photographer will come to school on Monday 7 March to take individual and family group photographs. Further details will be sent home with the children.

World War II Event - Monday 28 March

Children from P4 have been learning about World War II in World Around Us during the first term. They will be given the opportunity to visit the Palace Stables, Armagh on Monday 28 March and they will explore 'Life during the War' focusing on the Blitz, Evacuees and Rationing.

PTA - Friends of Birches

Thank you for supporting the PTA Christmas Raffle which raised a total of £955.00, and congratulations to those of you who won prizes. We are delighted to report that our PTA were awarded charity status in December 2021. This means that going forward the PTA are now eligible to apply for a greater range of publicly advertised grants. Our focus this year is on seeking funding to develop outdoor learning spaces. Recently, a grant application has been submitted to 'The National Lottery Community Fund: Living Places and Spaces' so please keep your fingers crossed as we await the outcome of the (expected March 2022). The PTA hope to organise a second fundraising event in Spring.

HEALTH AND SAFETY - SCHOOL CAR PARK ARRANGEMENTS

I would like to bring your attention to a few concerns we have about collection times in the school car park. **Specific problems are arising from:**

- Adults and children walking across the car park
- Cars stopping at the circle
- Lack of awareness and observation when reversing/parking

I understand that the parking in and around school at certain times can be difficult. Therefore, it is important that everyone plays their part in keeping our car park as safe as possible for everyone, particularly our children.

To improve the situation, I would ask that:

- All adults and children use the designated and clearly marked out pedestrian areas
- Cars should park in a bay so they are able to walk along the pedestrian areas (NOT across the car park).
- NO STOPPING around the 'circle' area
- Everyone drives safely, slowing and carefully both in the car park and the roads around school.

I appreciate that it is not always parents who do the school run so I would ask you to pass on the relevant information to whoever is dropping off/picking up your child/children. Thank you for your support in this.

School Procedures regarding Covid-19

As the Covid-19 virus is still present within our community, it is important that we maintain the measures we have been putting in place:

Covid-19 Prevention

- It is essential that all children are reminded of the importance of personal hygiene, particularly around the importance of regular handwashing.
- Children will be asked by staff to wash their hands regularly throughout the school day.
- The children will also be instructed to follow good respiratory hygiene, following the principle of 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' and will be discouraged from touching their eyes, face, nose and mouth.
- If your child is displaying any of the symptoms of Covid-19, they should stay at home and follow the latest Public Health advice. Symptoms include: raised temperature, persistent cough, loss of taste and loss of smell.
- If any child presents as unwell, parents/ guardians will be contacted.
- If any child displays symptoms of Covid-19, they, and any members of their household within the school setting, will be sent home from school and advised to follow the PHA guidance.
- If there is a confirmed case of someone in the school having the Covid-19 virus the school will follow the latest PHA and DE guidance.

Covid-19 Revised Guidance:

'The NI Executive has announced a change to the rules on self-isolation for positive cases, reducing the period from 10 days to 7 days, providing the individual has negative LFD results on both days 6 and 7 with tests taken 24 hours apart.'

Please ensure children's names are on all coats, sweatshirts and on clothes that are removed to change for P.E and swimming. If possible, use name tabs as names written in ink can wear off during the year. The only piece of jewellery to be worn in school is a watch.

For health and safety reasons earrings, rings and necklaces are not to be worn.

Contacting School

If you are concerned or unsure of anything relating to your child please do not worry at home, pick up the phone and speak to either Mrs Watson or your child's teacher. We will be only too willing to talk to you after school at a mutually convenient time.

Money Wallets

Money wallets are still available to buy from school. These come in packs of 40 at a cost of £3.00. These can be purchased from your child's class teacher.

Severe Weather Emergency Closure

We are coming back to that time of year again when heavy frost or snow could affect the running of our school.
