# Health and Safety – Car Park

I realise that parking in and around school can be difficult at pick up times. There are designated parking spaces in the parent/visitors car park and additional parking in the lay-by.

**Our priority in school is the safety of the children**. It has been brought to my attention that there have been some concerns about cars driving into areas which are designated areas for children to walk safely.

I would like you to make sure that whoever is collecting your child from school is made aware that they are not to park in the staff car park, or cross over the pedestrian crossing at the front of school.

I appreciate that it is not always parents who do the school run so I would ask you to pass on the relevant information to whoever is dropping off/picking up your child/children.

# Free School Meals ARE YOU ENTITLED TO FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

Parents/Guardians can apply if your son or daughter is in full-time education and if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits:-

Income Support; Income Based Jobseeker's Allowance; Income Related Employment and Support Allowance; Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit; Child Tax Credit or Working Tax Credit with an annual taxable income of £16,190 or less; Universal credit and have net household earnings not exceeding £14,000 per year.

#### **Money Wallets**

#### **Emergency Contact Numbers / Personal Details**

Please ensure the school has at least three up to date contact numbers for your child should you need to be contacted during school hours and while your child is travelling home on the school bus.

#### **Medical Information**

Please keep the school informed of any recently diagnosed allergies or other medical conditions.

#### **Allergies - Reminder**

We have children in school who have severe allergies. Therefore, it is extremely important that **NO NUTS or foods** containing nuts are to be brought to school by the children. Thank you.

#### **Contact Details**

Please ensure that school has an up to date phone number on which to contact you on. If you have moved house recently, please make sure that you have notified school of your child's new address. If you have not been receiving text messages from school, please contact Mrs Watson.

#### **School Uniform**

Please ensure children's names are on all coats and sweatshirts. Please use name tabs as names written in ink can wear off during the year.

The only piece of jewellery to be worn in school is a watch.

For health and safety reasons earrings, rings and necklaces are not to be worn.
